- "Standard grants" no deadlines, flexible around size
- Special calls https://epsrc.ukri.org/funding/calls/ deadlines, funding limits, often one off.
- New investigator- first application to EPSRC as PI- no financial limit, no deadline- different rules for different councils

Leverhulme trust

- Research project grants- not fundable by UKRI
- Phillip Leverhulme Prizes For researchers at an early stage of their careers whose work has had international impact and whose future research career is exceptionally promising - to use for any research purpose £100k
- Fellowships- buy out teaching time



Carnegie Trust- Scottish

Vacation scholarships for undergrads

PhD studentships (very competitive)

Workshop grants

Research incentive grants (internal process)



Industry partnership Funding Opportunities

- Interface- innovation vouchers- £5k and then £40k
- E.g. Internet of food things
- Co-funded studentships (Datalab, university)
- Professional doctorate
- KTP
- Technology Strategy Board
- Industrial Strategy- much bigger scale
